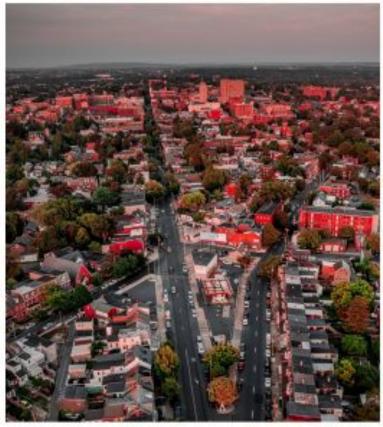

Mission

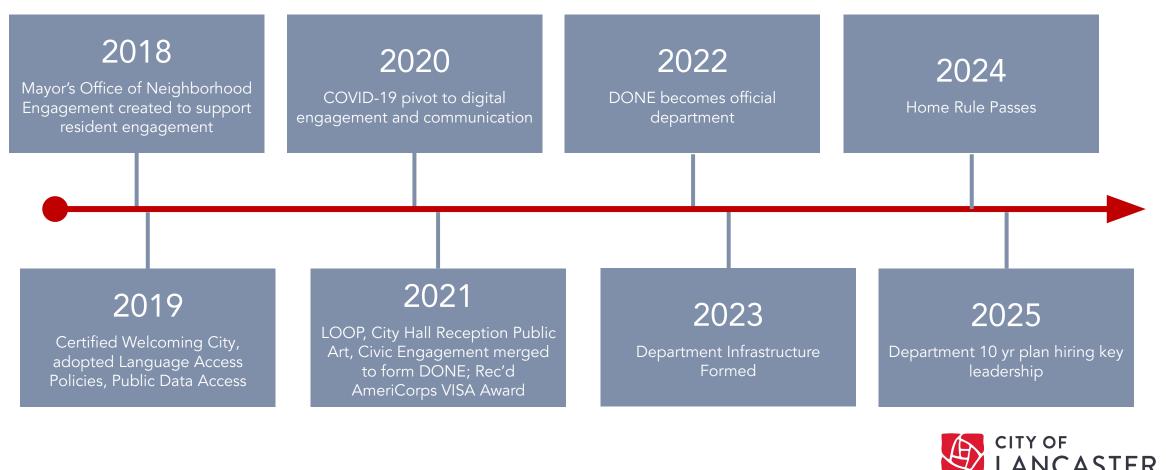

SCALING ENGAGEMENT BY CITY SIZE



Med City

- 2. Multiple programs academies)
- 3. Forums, pop-ups,
- Budget: \$250K-\$1M+
- 2–5 dedicated staff

Large City (250K+)

- Comprehensive, legal mandates
- Full suite: budgeting, civic tech, design labs
- Institutionalized citywide cycles
- Budget: \$1M-\$10M+
- 10–50+ staff in full department



EMBEDDING ENGAGEMENT ACROSS GOVERNMENT



Procurement & Contracting

Require engagement plans in RFPs; score vendors on public involvement strategies.



Capital & Project Planning

Hold pre-design sessions 'use co-design approaches for capital investment.



Grants & Funding

Use participatory review panels; include community in grant decisions-making.



Budgets & Allocations

Dedicate 1-3% of total project budgets to engagement activities and facilitation.



Policy Development

Host forums and working sessions prior to ordinance drafting and introduction.



Hiring & Workforce

Engage residents and staff in developing roles, expectations, and interview panels.



Evaluation & Reporting

Develop public dashboards and storytelling tools with community input.

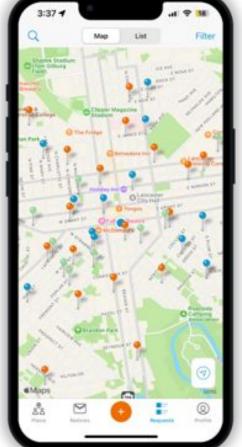

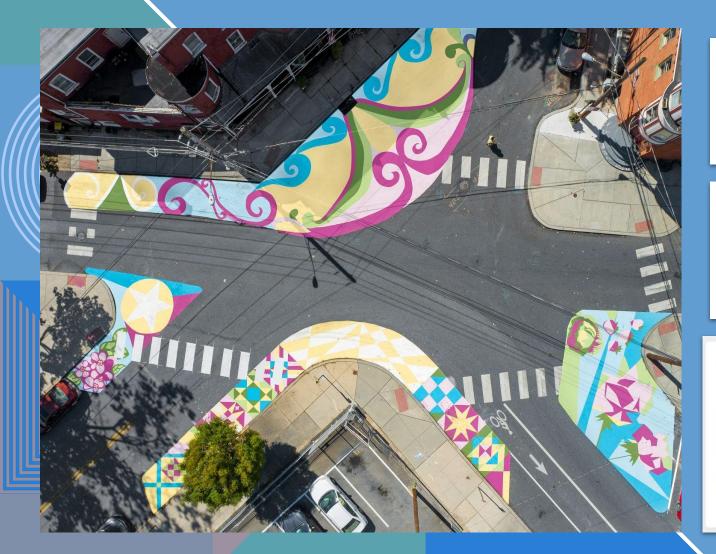

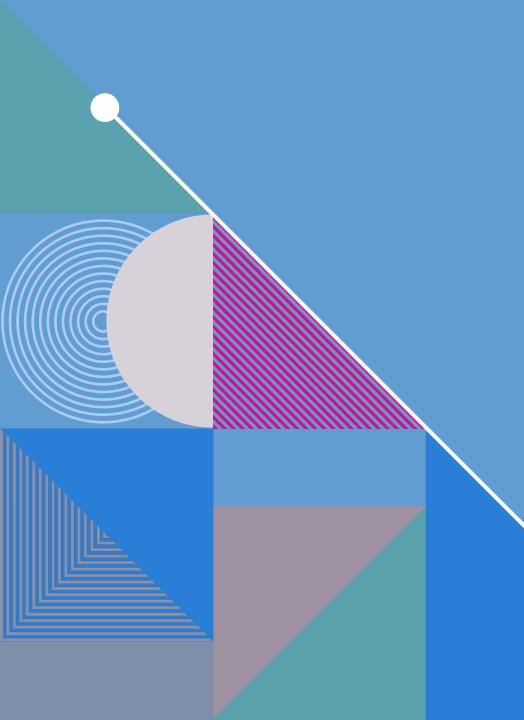




THINGS TO CONSIDER
