B. NARRATIVE

The Town of Waxhaw is pleased to submit this request for \$128,000 through the Safe Streets and Roads for All program to complete a new Safe Streets Action Plan. The plan will address each of the program's selection criteria and will provide a comprehensive approach to addressing the Town's roadway safety needs.

1. SAFETY IMPACT

The Town of Waxhaw experienced three (3) crashes – zero (0) serious injuries and three (3) fatalities from 2017-2021 – with a fatality rate of 14.6 per 100,000 population. Figure 1 demonstrates the steadily increasing fatality (or serious injury) rate in the last five (5) years. The vehicle-pedestrian fatality rate has also increased over this time. Considering these upward trends, a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan is necessary now to reduce injuries and fatalities. Waxhaw is committed to addressing safety issues for all road users.


Developing a High-Injury Network (HIN) as part of the Action Plan provides a better understanding of corridors with higher incidences of severe and fatal crashes in the community. The HIN showcases which corridors are most in need of safety improvements. The development process involves overlaying crash data with the road network to identify those critical corridors. Ultimately, these HIN corridor segments will be prioritized even further using contextual community criteria that provide customized guidance for prioritizing investments in safety that are most aligned with the Town's vision.


2. EQUITY

The Action Plan will work to address the safety needs of underserved communities. While Waxhaw has no designated Underserved Community Census tracts, the town is committed to providing safe and equitable streets for our growing diversity of residents. Based on the most recent census data available, our current population is almost 25% minority communities, which is an almost 60% increase since 2015. Additionally, over 10% of our population has either no or limited access to a vehicle. It's critical that we use this Action Plan to prioritize efforts to make safer streets in our minority communities and for those who travel via alternative modes (not just vehicles).

3. ADDITIONAL SAFETY CONTEXT

Waxhaw is the seventh fastest-growing municipality in North Carolina, with a rapidly growing population and no significant changes in the transportation structure to accommodate this growth. The Town of Waxhaw is uniquely positioned due to the rapid population growth experienced over the last ten years from a small rural town with a roadway network built for a population of 5,000 to a more densely populated area. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the town's population was a small community of 9,859 in 2010 and has grown to over 20,534 citizens, representing a 108% increase. While this type of population increase naturally leads to an ever-growing demand for increased services and operating expenses, it has more than anything shown that the town is lagging in keeping up with the transportation needs. For example, Waxhaw Engineering Department has struggled to keep up with the transportation demands of our community because the needs have increased tremendously in such a short amount of time. Citizen feedback from the Waxhaw Community Survey 2017 shared that residents were least satisfied with traffic flow & congestion (11%), and the #1 area of emphasis for town services should be traffic flow & congestion (85%). Similarly, in 2022, another community survey was conducted, resulting in 5% resident satisfaction with traffic flow & congestion (5%). Again, the #1 area of emphasis for town services was traffic flow & congestion (88%).



ETC Map


ETC Map of Waxhaw NC







Waxhaw NC Census Tracts



Resolution Endorsing the Town of Waxhaw's Application for the Safe Streets and Roads For All Grant

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation has established an annual grant program to provide funding for local projects that improve roadway safety;

WHEREAS, U.S. DOT has issued a call for applications for the 2023 Safe Streets and Roads For All (SS4A) Planning and Implementation Grants;

WHEREAS, the Waxhaw Board of Commissioners recognizes the importance of a safety action plan to help reduce the number of deaths and serious injuries on our highways, streets, and roads;

WHEREAS, the Town of Waxhaw is seeking endorsement from the Waxhaw Board of Commissioners to apply for the SS4A Planning Grant for the maximum amount of \$160,000 to develop an Action Plan;

WHEREAS, the Town of Waxhaw will contribute a 20 percent local match of \$32,000; and

WHEREAS, the staff recommends applying for the SS4A Planning Grant, which will fund the development of an Action Plan to improve roadway safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Waxhaw Board of Commissioners of the Town of Waxhaw, North Carolina hereby endorses the Town of Waxhaw's SS4A Planning Grant Application in the development of an Action Plan to improve roadway safety.
